 The children will learn about significant periods in British History– the second world war. This will include learning about the outbreak of WW2 and The Battle of Britain,

 Children will develop sketching and observational skills and improve their mastery of art techniques by using drawing and painting skills.

 Remembrance Day—Poppy Art work
 Making a Gas Mask

 Invasion Games: Children will develop their hand-eye co-ordination through tennis sessions (on a Tuesday afternoon).
